SAID was a Teaching Fellow in General Education for the academic years commencing in 1959 and 1960. He was a Teaching Fellow in History and Literature for the academic years 1961-1962 and 1962-1963.

Columbia professor blames racist attitude for Arab-Israeli conflict

A professor in the English and Comparative Literature Dept. at Columbia

University told a Ford Hall Forum audience last night that the white man has created the "racial distribution of guilt" and that this is what lies behind the

Arab-Israeli conflict.

According to Prof. Edward Said, a native Palestinian, the "racist" attitude Israel (the state) maintains towards the Arabs is "a

part of a whole chain of evil. Part of Western society is to exploit weaker peoples. The blacks in the West have learned this."

"The white man's way of responding to demands made of him by less developed people for their own human rights, their own human dignity, is to oppress them and to divide them."

Prof. Said said Arabs hate the Jews because the "white man has taught them to think Jews take all the money in the economy out for themselves. Jews in turn, are taught that Arabs want to wipe them out."

Furthermore, blacks are taught they are better fighters than Arabs, and vice versa. The purpose of all this is to keep Arabs, Jews and blacks divided, Prof. Said said, because the white man (and this includes Russian, British, French and and Americans) is afraid of what would happen if they united.

He said as long as Israeli leaders depend on Western leaders they will be dominated by a capitalistic, chauvinistic, racist will.

He said this will is manifested in Palestine by the Law of Return which Israel uses "not only to drive out Arabs but to keep them out. The effect of this law is to assert the superiority of Jews."

This law stipulates that any Jew from anywhere in the world may move to Israel and immediately become a full fledged citizen, whereas the same does not hold true for non-Jews.

He said Palestinian liberationists do not wish to push Jews into the sea, but to destroy a Jewish State, a state which practises superiority of one religion over all others.

He said Jews and Arabs should work together to create a real social and economic revolution which the world needs.

Marie Syrkin, professor emerita of Humanities at Brandeis University, spoke from the point of view of Israel during the Forum debate entitled "The Arab-Israeli Conflict."

"We will not agree to an

Arab-Palestine, Democrat, or not," she said. "The Jewish state will continue to assert its right to self-determination."

She asserted that it was the Arab high command that created the Arab refugee problem with statements like one she attributed to Nasser claiming that if the Arabs returned to Palestine, Israel would cease to exist.
