2. (S) SUMMARY: THE SECRETARY AND CROWN PRINCE ABDULLAH  
MET IN PARIS TO REVIEW THE SECRETARY'S MEETINGS IN THE  
REGION TO REINVIGORATE THE CEASE-FIRE BETWEEN THE ISRAELIS  
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AND PALESTINIANS.

ASSURED THE CROWN PRINCE THAT THE U.S. WAS CONCERNED WITH

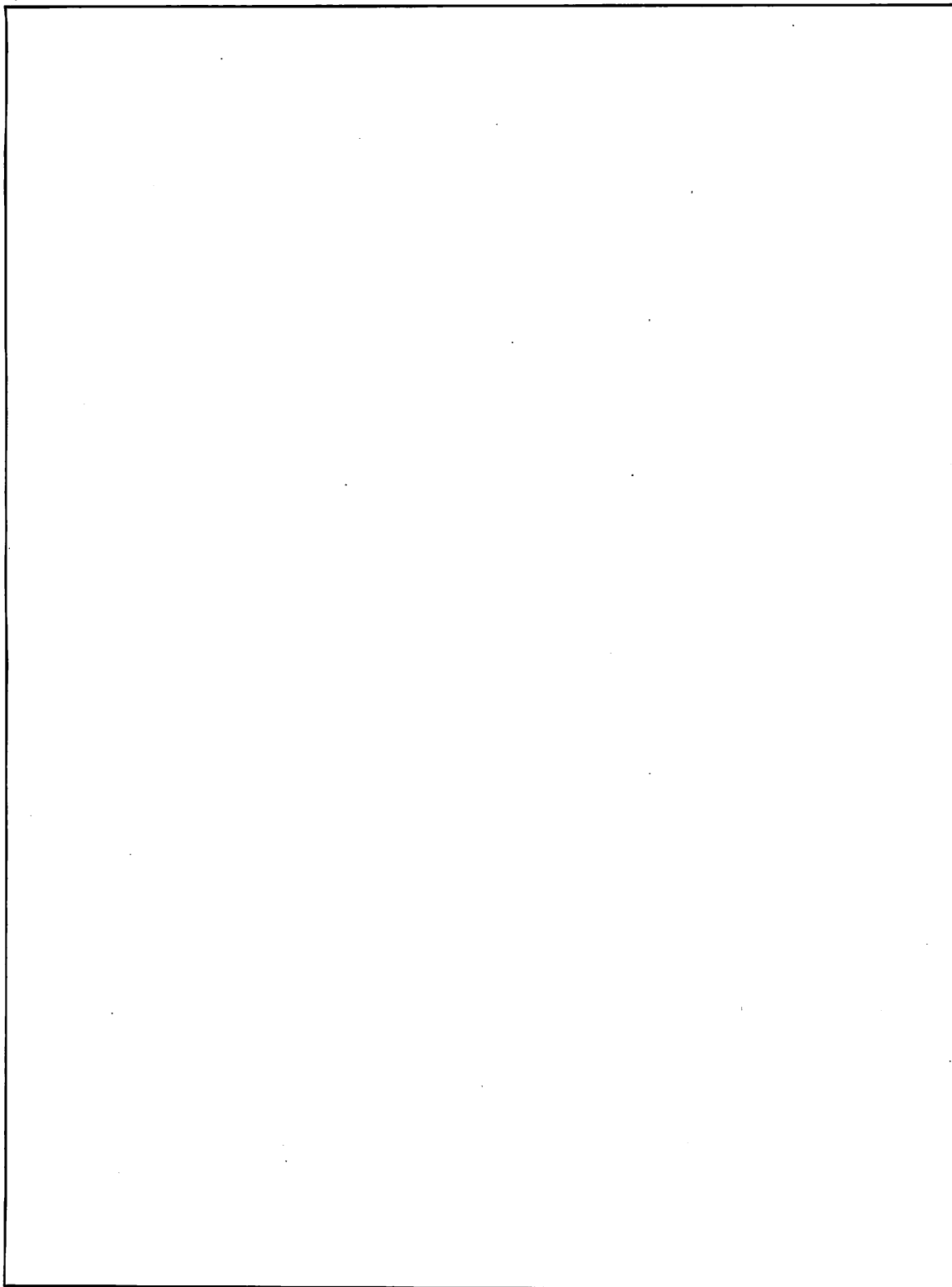

3. (S) THE SECRETARY BEGAN THE MEETING BY NOTING HIS  
DISCUSSIONS OVER THE PRECEDING 48 HOURS HAD BEEN  
DIFFICULT, BUT HE WAS HOPEFUL. THE SECRETARY EXPLAINED TO  
THE CROWN PRINCE THAT HE HAD DELIVERED A CONSISTENT  
MESSAGE TO BOTH PARTIES THAT VIOLENCE MUST BE REDUCED AND  
PEOPLE MUST BE MADE TO FEEL SECURE IN THEIR HOMES AND  
WORKPLACES. HE EMPHASIZED THAT THESE STEPS NEEDED TO BE  
UNDER THE AUSPICES OF THE MITCHELL PLAN.

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8. (S) THE SECRETARY AGREED THE US RELATIONSHIP WITH THE KINGDOM WAS STRONG AND SOLID AND WOULD ENDURE. THE U.S., THE SECRETARY ARGUED, HAS ALWAYS BEEN A LEADER IN SEEKING FREEDOM AND JUSTICE FOR PEOPLE AROUND THE WORLD. IT HAS A HISTORY AND FRIENDSHIP WITH ISRAEL OVER THE LAST 53 YEARS, BUT THE U.S. ALSO HAS RESPECT AND FRIENDSHIP FOR THE PALESTINIANS. HE REMINDED THE CROWN PRINCE THAT THE U.S. HAS BEEN WORKING TOWARDS A PEACEFUL SOLUTION TO THE CONFLICT BETWEEN THE PALESTINIANS AND ISRAELIS THROUGHOUT MANY ADMINISTRATIONS. IN THE CURRENT SITUATION, THOUGH,

THE SECRETARY CANNOT MOVE NEGOTIATIONS FORWARD WHILE VIOLENCE CONTINUES. HE REMINDED THE CROWN PRINCE THAT

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ROCKS WERE NOT WHAT KILLED 20 ISRAELI TEENAGERS IN A NIGHTCLUB IN TEL AVIV.

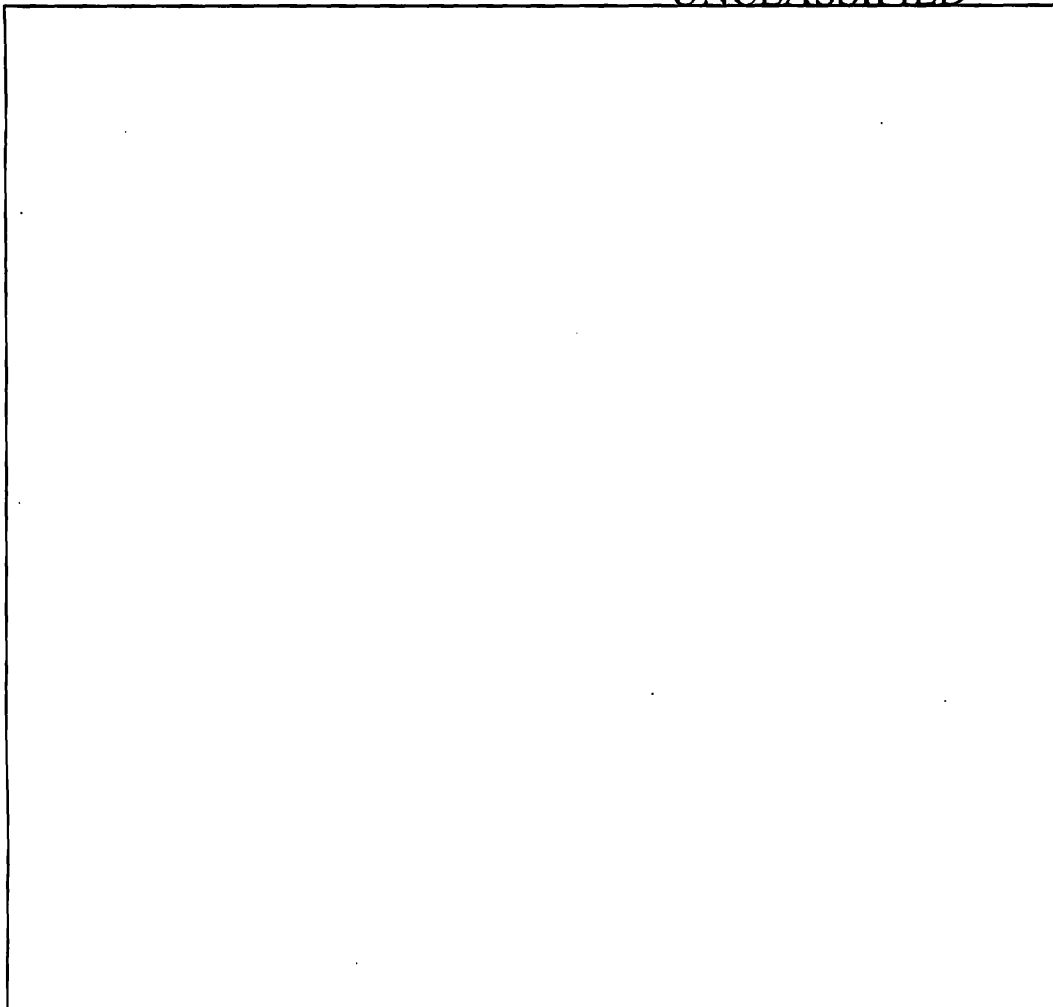
