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January 13, 2007 of the shooting death of American citizen Hector Carrisal Patino. Patino served as a civilian driver for contractor Kellogg, Brown and Root Company and he was en route to collect garbage from the hospital when he was shot. According to the RSO's investigation, Australian and U.S. military guards at the controlled vehicle access shared by the Australian Embassy and the CSH shot and killed Patino when he failed to respond to commands to stop at the second checkpoint. Hospital doctors pronounced his death when he was brought into the emergency room at 0840.

At the request of the KBR Liaison to U.S. Embassy Baghdad, Conoff waited until KBR could notify [redacted] later in the same day in person before Conoff called the family to express condolences and an offer of assistance. KBR has assigned a representative to work directly with the family to meet their administrative needs. KBR also reports that the company will provide financial benefits to the family. Conoff and KBR performed a joint inventory of Patino's personal belongings and KBR will ship them to [redacted] KBR will have a representative at Dover Air Force Base to assist the family as needed with the disposition of the body.

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Mr. Patino's remains arrived at Dover Air Force Base at 1020 Tuesday, January 16. On January 13, at the request of KBR, [redacted] had signed a document authorizing an autopsy on Hector Patino's body. On January 15, [redacted] informed Conoff that [redacted] had changed her mind and requested that no autopsy be performed, or at the least, that the procedure be minimally invasive. Conoff informed KBR and Dover of their request but warned the family that an autopsy may be required.

1) (C) Summary: On 18 January 2006 a successful IED attack was carried out against a CPATT convoy resulting in the death of two American citizens. One American citizen and one Iraqi national were wounded in the attack. The perpetrators have not yet been found.

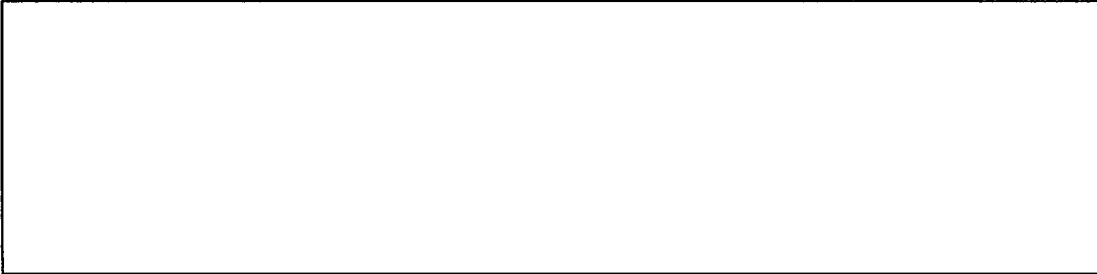

2) (C) On January 18, 2006 at approximately 1330hrs a Civilian Police Assistance Training Team/International Police Liaison Officer (CPATT/IPLO) team stationed at the Shatt-Al-Arab Hotel (UK FOB) left the U.S. Regional Embassy Office (REO) Basrah to return to base. The convoy comprised of two level 6 Suburbans. Four personnel were traveling in the lead vehicle and three people were in the follow-on vehicle. The convoy was traveling on a narrow road roughly two kilometers southwest of the Shatt-Al-Arab Hotel. The lead vehicle made contact with an IED, which was hidden in a large dirt mound, on its right side. The second vehicle continued through the blast area undamaged.

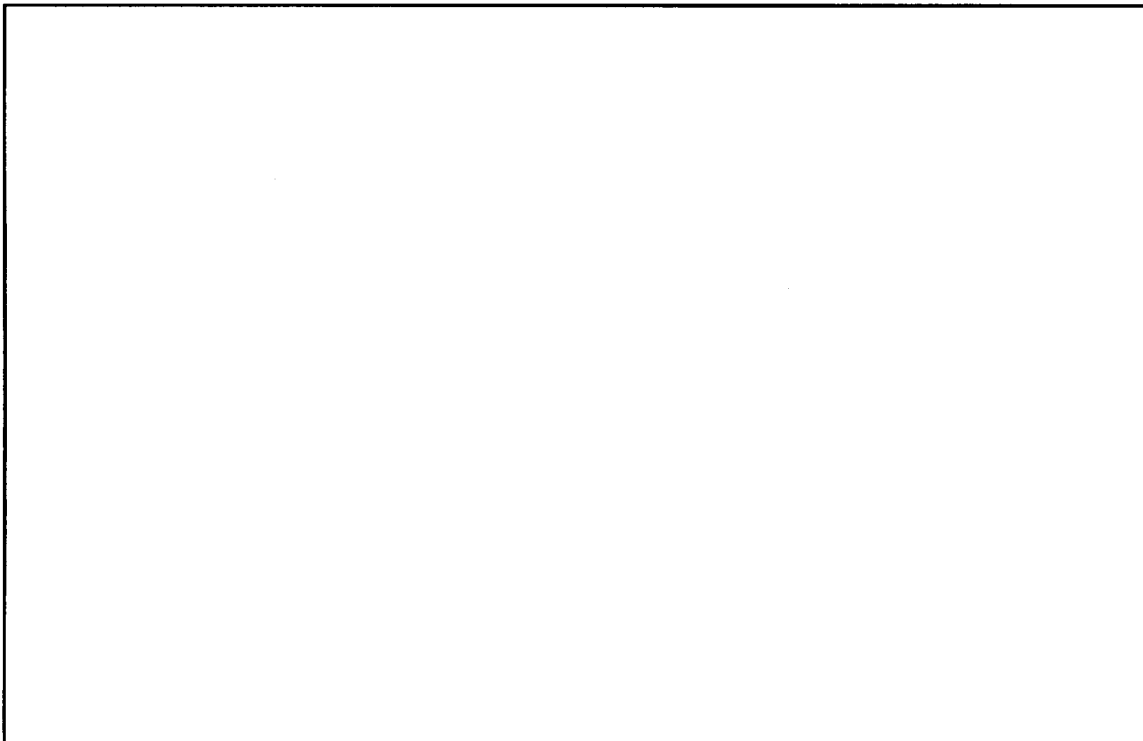
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3) (C) Members from the second vehicle immediately deployed, set up a security perimeter and began extracting the injured from the lead vehicle. A PSD team, Unity Resource Group (URG), traveling in close proximity responded to the blast and assisted with the wounded, transporting them to the British medical facility at the Shatt-Al-Arab Hotel. The three CPATT members who were unharmed stayed at the scene with the KIA.



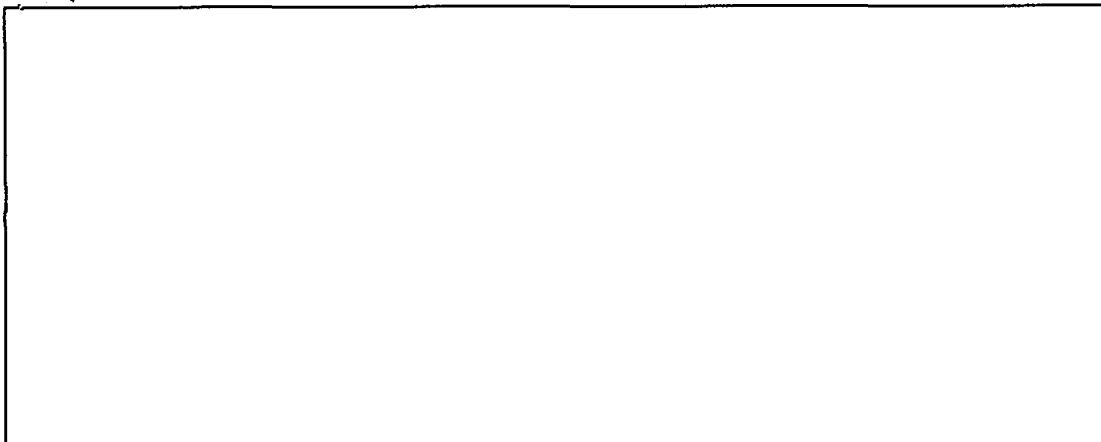
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5) (C) The blast impacted the front passenger side of the vehicle. The CPATT member sitting in the front passenger seat was killed instantly. The driver suffered massive head injuries and died of his wounds while being flown from the Shatt-Al-Arab Hotel to Shaibah Combat Hospital. The two team members in the backseat were also wounded. One, an Iraqi interpreter, had his right arm amputated and is in stable condition. The other team member, the medic, suffered shrapnel wounds and lacerations and is also in stable condition.



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
